FOMH - Ride4ceylon - Institute of Medical Sciences: three co-equal charities working to preserve a Ceylonese Heritage

Friends of Manipay Hospital (FOMH) was founded in 2005 to revive Green Memorial Hospital from its war damaged dilapidated state. The American Ceylon Medical Mission in Jaffna began in 1819 and Green Hospital Manipay was started by Dr Samuel Green in 1850 along with a medical school and provided western medicine and medical education to the local community. Dr Green was a medical graduate from what is now Columbia University in New York USA. Colombo Medical School was established 20 years later in 1870 and gradually the Manipay Medical school was wound down and closed but Green Memorial Hospital continued to serve the local community until it became unsustainable during the 30 year war in Sri Lanka.

In addition to refurbishing the buildings and running clinical services for a community that was recovering from war, one of the medical trustees of FOMH also had a vision for re-starting the medical school that had by now ceased to function. FOMH Trustees together with leading medical clinicians in Jaffna established the Institute of Medical Sciences (IMS) in 2014 to advance this concept exclusively at GMH premises. FOMH was delighted and grateful that Bishop Thiagarajah was in agreement with this vision and signed several agreements with FOMH.

FOMH raised funds from donor families, other charitable organisations and the Trustees themselves also made contributions. The funds were channelled to IMS and IMS began providing clinical services at Green Memorial Hospital in 2014. IMS works exclusively for the advancement of GMH. IMS from small

beginnings restored clinical services at Green Hospital and runs niche services such as free Family Medicine and Paediatrics as well as in-patient neuro-rehabilitation. IMS provides training for school leavers to become Healthcare Professionals and at the beginning helped orphanages by taking in children who had to leave orphanages on reaching 18 years of age.

Ride4Ceylon is an entity that was initially started as a brand for fund raising by FOMH in March 2018. It has now organised itself as an independent charity based in Sri Lanka as from August 2021. It is run by a committee headed by Mr David Rasiah, Mr Nishantha Abeywardene and Mr Sriomal DeSilva. FOMH has raised substantial funds through ride4ceylon to revive and restore Green Memorial Hospital and make it a proper Hospital. Photographs of the transformation and funding arrangements is the main focus of this report.

Prof Rajendra Surenthirakumar (Dean of Jaffna Medical Faculty of the University of Jaffna) who was founding President of IMS is also the Chairman of the Medical Advisory Board for GMH. He is ably supported by several medical Trustees including a family physician, two surgeons and a senior anaesthetist. IMS Trust is registered as a not-for-profit entity in Sri Lanka.

IMS serves as the local delivery partner for FOMH and is the main medical service provider at GMH. All FOMH funds are directly transferred to IMS for specific projects aimed at restoration of buildings or clinical services at GMH. FOMH also assisted GMH by sending over surgeons and doctors from UK including an Orthopaedic Surgeon and Breast Surgeon and Dr George Mather Dental Surgeon who undertook several free clinics at GMH.

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In the last decade Green Memorial Hospital has been transformed beyond recognition, and provides a valuable service to the people of Jaffna. The JDCSI Church in providing the land lease (with the buildings that FOMH renovated to bring into clinical use) along with their great vision and ride4ceylon who have raised funds and IMS who provide the clinical services, can all indeed be enormously proud of this great achievement.

Dear Brothers in Christ,





(contd) As you are aware, in October 2004, the then Bishop of the JDCSI, Rev Dr Jebanesan, wrote to the four of us, requesting assistance in collecting funds to help restore Green Memorial Hospital to its former state. It was at this request that I agreed to be one of the directors when the company was formed in June 2005. My decision to stand down as a trustee in August 2006 was for health reasons. (contd)

As you are aware, following my decision to step down, I have not fulfilled any of the roles of a trustee – in deliberating, planning or implementing any of the activities of the charity.

Jaffna

The first building shown below is the Sellamuttu Block for Paediatrics. Originally built in 1930 it was opened by Sir Herbert Stanley then Governor of Ceylon. It was built with the philanthropy of Sellamuttu family of Manipay.

Dr Kumaran an IMS trustee and a Senior Lecturer at Jaffna Medical Faculty is in overall charge of the Paediatric unit and runs apart from standard out-patient Paediatric services a highly specialist service for children affected by autism.

The revenue costs for staff to undertake the free paediatric clinics since the outset was Rs 2 million including doctors, nurses and healthcare professionals.

Restoration of Nurse quarters was undertaken by FOMH in the years 2017 and 2018. This was originally built to house the Willis Pierce Nursing School with the help of American donors in 1937.

IMS is able to accommodate students training as healthcare professionals in this building. It also houses nursing staff at GMH.



Doctors quarters (repaired by FOMH 2017-2020)

The initial round of repairs was funded by the Mather family.



The Mather family with Dr Selvan Mather, Mr Upali DeSilva and Mrs Shanthi DeSilva at the hospital where Dr Mather wanted to celebrate his 60th Birthday having gone all the way from UK nd overseeing the results of Doctors quarters repairs and running free dental clinics.





Centenary block (repaired 2019-2021)

This was built in 1950.

The funding appeal for this was started by Dr Buell in 1946 who was the Medical Director at the time and the appeal was headed by the Governor Sir Henry Monck-Mason Moore and Hon. George De Silva Minister of Health. On 11th April 1950 the Centenary block was opened by the then Prime Minister Rt Hon D.S. Senanayake. It had become severely dilapidated and the roof and operating theatre was renovated by Friends of Manipay Hospital through funds raised by ride4Ceylon in 2020.



Family Medicine/Admin Block (2017-2019)

Dr Kumaran an IMS Medical Trustee runs free Family Medicine clinics in the Family Medicine block twice weekly. Prof Datuk Thuraiappah from Malaysia supported the Family medicine centre with the original concept and finance.




The ambulance was also used during covid period to send out medical and allied health staff to see patients in their own homes



Jameson Block repairs was undertaken by FOMH 2012-2021

Jameson Block was originally built in 1930. It was damaged by civil conflict and was unusable for any clinical activity and was restored to full function at a cost rs 10,million by FOMH (paid for by main trustees of FOMH Dr Jayantha Arnold and Anandan Arnold). The restoration work started in 2012. Photographs below are from the time before restoration started..

Jameson block was the most war damaged building in the hospital before FOMH undertook the repairs



Paramedical IMS students being trained at GMH standing in front of fully refurbished Jameson Block. More than 100 students have qualified with certification or Diplomas which are approved by the Sri Lankan Government and around 75 students are currently in training. Manithaneyam Trust funds helps with the Certificate in Healthcare Training and Sathyarupa Charitable Trust from USA generously supports the Diploma in Nursing course. Several other courses allied to Medicine are also provided and IMS is approved by Sri Lankan Government as a training provider.
